MDOT: STOP ON RED



With HoCo schools back in session on Monday, August 26, more school buses will be back on the road. Now is a good time to remind young drivers, friends and family about the importance of stopping for a school bus.

BE ALERT especially in school zones, near school bus stops, and during times of the day that students will be going to and coming

from school.

STOP FOR THE BUS because passing a school bus is illegal when its red lights are flashing and the stop-arm is extended while stopped to load and unload students.

REMEMBER students of all ages are unpredictable. It is your job as the driver to obey traffic laws.

Safe Schools Maryland

Safe Schools Maryland is an anonymous and free reporting system available to students, teachers, staff members, parents, and the general public to report any school or student safety concerns, including mental health concerns.



Safe Schools Maryland is Maryland's only official anonymous reporting system. Safe

Schools Maryland operates 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and 365 days a year. Your anonymous report can be submitted by calling the tip line (1-833-MD-B-SAFE / 1-833-632-7233), completing an online form or downloading the free Safe Schools Maryland app from the App Store or Google Play.

All students should feel comfortable in Maryland's schools. Children and young adults are stronger students when they feel safe and secure. Strong students go on to serve as the foundation for strong communities.

Safe Schools Maryland exists to ensure that our schools and our students remain safe and secure. With Safe Schools Maryland, all interested members of our communities are able to report their school and student safety concerns anonymously and securely.



Posters Created by HoCo Kids: Again Delivered to 34 Schools










Maryland's Good Samaritan Law PROTECTS YOU.











This month, our adult and student team delivered the above 8 posters to 20 HCPSS middle schools, 13 HCPSS high schools, and Glenelg Country School. In addition, posters featuring HoCo students addressing the topic of not sharing medication were also delivered. If you see our posters in your child's school, please send us a photo or let us know what you think of them (and be sure to thank the school staff for displaying them).

Topics included: Maryland's Good Samaritan Law, vaping is smoking (because too many of our HoCo kids don't think vaping is dangerous!), weed/marijuana, managing anxiety, fentanyl awareness, opioid overdose symptoms, how to respond to an opioid overdose, and how to make a difference by joining HC Teen Advisory Council. All posters direct students to our website to access more information about the specific topic as well as how to get more involved with like-minded HoCo students this school year.

Each summer, HC DrugFree's staff works with students from across Howard County to gather youth feedback and create educational materials designed to address important and timely issues in our community. 
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
