

HCPD Released Opioid Overdose Data

The Howard County Police Department released data for the first half of 2021 as 5 fatal and 67 non-fatal opioid overdoses.

2021 opioid-related overdose deaths may increase once autopsy results are released.

CDC: 91,862 Overdose Deaths in One Year

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) unofficially reported that drug overdose deaths accelerated due to COVID-19. Provisional data

reports 91,862 overdose deaths occurred in the U.S. between October 2020-2021, the largest number ever recorded.

Stay Safe This Holiday Weekend

According to the American Automobile Association (AAA), this Independence Day holiday period from Thursday, July 1 to Monday, July 5 will see about 47.7 million Americans travel. Of those, nearly 44 million are expected to drive to their destinations. Car travel levels are predicted to exceed the 2019 pre-pandemic volume and set a new record high.

Juul to Pay \$40 Million

Youth vaping rates declined last year following a new federal ban on fruit-flavored vapes and an increase to 21 in the legal age to buy tobacco products. Last week, Juul agreed to pay North Carolina \$40 million to settle vaping accusations that it aggressively marketed products to youth. [Read more.](#)
